***Congratulation, to both the Bass Fishing Team and the Boys Golf Program for some major accomplishments in their seasons. We don't generally hear much about these programs; some of you may not have even known we had such teams.***

The NHIAA introduced Bass Fishing as a team sport in 2011. Students participate from across the State in a Spring and Fall Tournament. The winners are determined by the total weight of the specific number of fish caught (8) per team. This fall the qualifying tournament was held on Lake Winnepesaukee, and Sunapee's team of Senior Chris Harrington and Sophomore Jordan Spear finished third out of 33 boats. The top 11 went on to the State Meet which was held on Lake Winnisquam where the Sunapee Team finished 2nd for the 2014 runner up plaque. Special thanks to

Sunapee's Golf Team made it into the State Tournament for the first time! The team finished with a record of 14 and 11. Our students who played in the State Tournament were Matt Tenney, Mike Platt, Issaiah Chappell, Cole Cruz, Raymond Cabral and Connor Fleury. In the Division IV Tournament the team only lost to Moultonborough and Profile by 4 shots. Mike Platt made the cut and qualified to play in the individual State Tournament in Division

IV. "Platt is a tough kid mentally and that is a big part of the reason he is returning. I don't often tell kids they have to make a certain number on a hole but I thought Mike was close to the cut so I told him he needed to make a 4 on the last hole- and he did it." said Coach Kennedy. Matt Tenney started slow but turned it around and only missed the cut by 1 shot. Mike Platt played well in the individual tournament shooting a 42 on the front 9; he finished 5th overall.
